- A - 9:00: Load bus at the Washington Conservation District at 1380 West Frontage Road, Highway 36, Stillwater
- B & C - 9:10: Brown's Creek Tributaries – Boutwell Road
- D - 9:15: (*Drive-by*) Brown's Creek – Hwy 15/96 Crossing – baseline monitoring site
- E - 9:15: (*Drive-By*) Mendel Tributary Wetland – one of the most significantly impacted wetlands in the District
- F - 9:20: Brown's Creek – 110<sup>th</sup> Street Crossing – TMDL monitoring site
- G - 9:35: Brown's Creek Headwaters – 121<sup>st</sup> Street
- H - 9:50: Benz Lake– management plan is complete. Working with landowners to improve water quality with BMP Cost-share
- I - 10:10: Brown's Creek – Gateway Trail Crossing
- J - 10:30: Masterman Lake – 2009 Lake Management Plan
- K - 10:50: (*Drive-by*) Brown's Creek – Costa – potential stream restoration site
- L - 11:10: Brown's Creek – Brown's Creek Trails Park – potential wetland/stream restoration site (*approximately ¼ mile of walking on uneven ground*)
- M - 11:25: (walk to site) TSMP/Diversion Structure (*approximately ¼ mile of walking on uneven ground*)
- N - 11:40: Brown's Creek – Oak Glen Golf Course – potential stream restoration site (*approximately ½ mile of walking on uneven ground*)
- O - 12:05: (walk/bus to site) Brown's Creek – Stonebridge – potential stream restoration site
- P - 12:30: (walk/bus) Brown's Creek – walk along Zephyr Tracks (*approximately 1 mile of walking*)
- Q - 1:00: Return to the Washington Conservation District
