

Resolution No. 06-06

**BROWN'S CREEK WATERSHED DISTRICT BOARD OF MANAGERS  
FINAL CERTIFIED 2007 TAX LEVY RESOLUTION: ALL FUNDS**

Manager Vanzwol offered the following resolution and moved its adoption, seconded by Manager Leiser.

WHEREFORE the Brown's Creek Watershed District Board of Managers has adopted Resolution 06-05 setting a budget for the year of 2007 for the following purposes and in the following amounts:

1. General Fund: \$119,649 for the purpose of paying the administrative expenses of the District as provided by Minnesota Statute §103D.905, subdivision 3; and,
2. Management Planning Fund: \$830,299 for the purpose of paying the cost of watershed management planning and implementation of specific projects according to the Watershed Management Plan, as provided by Minnesota Statutes 103B.241.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that a mill rate shall be levied on all taxable property in the Brown's Creek Watershed District, Washington County, State of Minnesota, for the year of 2007, in the amount of the aforementioned budget, a total of \$949,948, less revenues in the amount of \$173,768, resulting in a tax levy of \$776,180.

THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Brown's Creek Watershed District Board reaffirm Resolution No. 06-05 and submit the payable 2007 final levy certification to Washington County with no changes.


Upon this vote, the Chair declared the Resolution adopted.
